An Explanation of the Good Friday Service:

This is a service of "tenebrae," which means "darkness." The service includes Scripture, music, prayers and a meditation, followed by seven selected readings from the Gospels marking Jesus betrayal, arrest and crucifixion. At the conclusion of each reading a candle will be extinguished and the lights dimmed until the sanctuary is immerse in darkness. Worshipers are asked to leave the sanctuary in silence, remembering the sacrifice of our Lord.
