
JOY Class: exploring a unique and different approach in the study of Bible Scripture called *The Serendipity Bible*.


BIBLE STUDY WITH PASTOR OSCAR

Lesson Four: The Prodigal Child, the Eldest Child, and the Devoted Parent



For backpacks, we hope to collect 50% for elementary kids

and 50% for teens. Full size backpacks are best so that they have room for us to fill the bags. For the teens, these are typically around 17" or bigger, which it will usually state on the tags. Brand-name backpacks such as Puma, Adidas, Champion, Jansport, and Nike are preferred for the teens to help them fit in with peers in a new school. For elementary kiddos, any quality brands will be great. The goal is for these bags to last all year. Look for a sign in Reception hall of where to drop off the backpacks.
